#### SERVANTS FOR HAITI, INC SHORT TERM MISSION TRIP TO HAITI

for adults and youth 14 and older October 29 – November 5, 2011

In November 2011, Servants for Haiti, Inc. will be leading a short term mission trip to Haiti. This will be a construction team working with ASAM Ministries, led by Andre and Sylvie Drisdelle. André and Sylvie have been established in Haiti full time for the past two years. In the last year they have opened a guest house for teams coming from outside Haiti. This enables the teams to come knowing that they have a safe place to stay with bathrooms, showers, food etc. The house is close to the tent cities and other sites where people need their help. Recently, Andre and Sylvie have started a small home for orphans and children whose parents cannot take care of them in light of their current living situation.

The teams who have come in the past are usually medical teams, construction teams, or evangelization teams. It is our hope that we will be working in a tent city, helping to build shelters that have concrete floors, tin walls, and a locking door.

After the earthquake, thousands of people have had to live in tents with nowhere else to go. Many people will live in these tents for the rest of their lives. As you can imagine, tents do not provide the security that families need to keep their children and belongings safe. The shelters that we will be building will help families be able to lock their doors at night.

The construction teams bring the funds for to pay for the houses they plan to build during the week. The money is usually sent beforehand so that ASAM can purchase the needed materials and receive them in time. The materials are bought locally to encourage the Haitian economy. ASAM has some experienced young Haitian men who help the team members build. To build a shelter home, the cost is \$750 US per home. The house is big enough for an average 8-person family who have lived under plastic since the earthquake. The team will build a number of these houses, depending on the size of the team.

### **Daily Schedule:**

7:30 am – breakfast
8:30 am – departure for the construction site
12:00 pm – lunchtime at the guest house
1:00 pm – departure for the construction site
5:00-5:30 pm – pm return to guest house
6:00 pm – supper
7:00 pm – devotion/debrief time

On Thursdays, we usually take the team to visit downtown - Presidential Palace, Champs de Mars, tin market, and a place for souvenirs - as well as to a restaurant with Haitian meals.

On Sunday, we usually go to Church On the Rock in Delmas 31 for service at 8:45 am. It is possible to relax, visit or build during the afternoon, as the team wishes.

#### **FORMS**

The following forms need to be filled out and returned by Sept 1, 2011: Application Form, Team Member Reference Form, Questionnaire, and Parental Permission Form. A \$250 deposit must accompany these forms to hold your space. The deposit will be applied to the trip cost. There is a limit of 20 people per team.

#### **TRIP COST**

Each team member is responsible for their flight reservations. We will let you know which flights to book. Flights should run about \$500.00. Please do not book flights until we confirm the flight numbers and times. There is an additional team cost of \$700.00 to cover room and board, traveling expenses, and supplies. You will also want to bring money for shopping and sightseeing. The final amount is due by Sept 29, 2011. If you feel that you may have a difficult time affording this trip, but feel the Lord leading you to go, you may want to consider asking your church, family, and friends for support.

### **PASSPORTS**

Passports are required. If you already have a passport, please check the dates on your passport to make sure it is still valid. If you procrastinate in getting your passport, expediting it is **VERY COSTLY!** <u>Please send us a copy of your passport.</u>

### **IMMUNIZATIONS**

There are certain shots and immunizations that you should get when traveling to Haiti. A up-to-date tetanus shot is required. For all other immunizations please consult a travel clinic to find out what they suggest for Haiti at this time. Usually a Typhoid shot and Malaria pills are recommended.

#### **LUGGAGE**

You are allowed to check one large piece of luggage that CANNOT EXCEED 50 LBS. You are also permitted one carry-on suitcase and a small carry-on such as a backpack or handbag that can fit under the seat. We will ask you to pack some supplies needed for the trip in one of your suitcases.

#### **TRIP SUPPLIES**

Below is a list of supplies that will be donated if you can bring them. Currently ASAM has the following three children in their orphanage for whom they are seeking clothing and shoes:

- a two-year-old boy
- a four-year-old girl (currently wears clothes for 24 months)
- an eight-year-old girl (tall but very thin; fits in 6-year-old clothes but the pants end up being three quarter)

They have also requested underwear, deodorant, shoes, rain coats (ponchos, etc.), hats, and sunglasses. In the past we have also brought some of the following items

- Chewable children's vitamins
- Chewable Tylenol
- Adult Tylenol
- Selsun shampoo (used to treat many fungal skin problems)
- Hydrocortisone creams
- · Antifungal creams
- Antibiotic creams
- Saline eye drops
- Tums
- Cold medications

- Toothbrushes
- Toothpaste
- Soap
- Peanut butter
- Jelly
- Toilet paper
- Powdered drink mix
- Diapers are always helpful, cloth can be rewashed.
- Used summer clothing

#### Important:

Once in Haiti, CD players, MP3 players, iPhones, iPods, and any other music players may only be used in your bedroom at bed time. Use of such devices is not permitted at any other time. They should not be used while in a group or outside the bedroom. We encourage team members not to shut themselves off by listening to music. It is best to spend your time socializing with team members, friends, and the people you meet in Haiti.

SFH does not allow the purchase of alcohol while traveling on a team with us.
