Although Haiti started as the most prosperous colony in the New World - it was known as the "Pearl of the Antilles" - it has devolved into the poorest nation in the Western Hemisphere.

Since its independence, the nation has remained shackled by the harsh task-masters of injustice, oppression, and poverty, much of it at the hands of more prosperous nations. We think it's time to start giving back.

Home building - We still perform relief in the form of building homes for the homeless.

The ultimate goal of SFH is to make it extinct once and for all, so that the people of Haiti can be truly free and independent.
